September 25, 2020; Portland, OR: With their ongoing devotion to equity and inclusion, the members of Fear No Music stand up to systemic racism with *Tomorrow Is My Turn*, a donation-based virtual season entirely dedicated to the work of Black composers. With a title borrowed from Nina Simone's yearning ballad, the series offers a small glimpse into the breadth and depth of phenomenal music being created by Black artists across the nation.

This season, thoughtfully curated specifically for an optimal online listening experience, offers four mini-concerts of 20-30 minutes and a headliner, all of which showcase the tremendous talent of the Fear No Music musicians in rarely heard solo performances.
